HEALTH AND SAFETY INFORMATION

Tummy Bugs It is very important that if your child is absent from school due to a tummy bug they should not return to school for 48 hours after their last bout of sickness or diarrhoea. This is the advice given by the Health Protection Agency to ensure that viruses are not passed from one child to another throughout the whole school community.

Please can you also encourage your child to adopt good hygiene practices, remembering to wash their hands after using the toilet.

Head Lice

Please can you check your child's hair for head lice on a regular basis.

The recommendation from the school nurse is to check hair every

3-4 days. This is best done on wet hair using a fine tooth comb. If you have any concerns, you can discuss these with the school nurse by making an appointment via the school office.

<u>Absence</u> – If your child is ill and will not be attending school you must contact the school office as soon as possible on the first day of absence. You can either phone, e-mail or call into the office. If we do not hear from you, our Attendance Clerk will contact you to discuss the reason for your child's absence.
