Outcomes to date:

Last year was the first year we received the PE and sports grant. Our end of year results show the impact it has had on the development of the children. Only one child did not meet age related expectations, this was because he found it difficult to take part in PE due to his special needs. The rest of the children achieved or exceeded age related expectations.

Our focus last year was on staff development, as they felt they needed support developing a range of lessons that showed progression and needed new ideas. As a result of this most children have made excellent progress.

Next steps:

I will continue to support staff, developing their teaching in PE, to ensure all teaching is good or outstanding. In the spring term I will be observing PE lessons and interview children to determine their views on PE activities.

Staff are currently assessing PE on a regular basis to show progression and any children that are not making progress or working below age related we will look at ways to enhance their physical development.

After discussion with F2 staff, they feel they need more equipment to support them in ensuring all children meet age related expectations of exceed. We will be looking at this over the next few months.

Year 2 children will be taking in part in termly climbing activities along with Sandbrook Primary School. Some of our staff will become instructors in climbing. I am currently pricing climbing apparatus for our playground.
