School Uniform The Government is suggesting that children should be back in their school uniform from September, but it needs to be clean each day, so we ask that you try to ensure this happens when we return to school in September.

**Lunches** The normal school menu will be available for children on return to school in September and this has already been emailed to parents. At the current time we aim to offer all options unless guidance issued in August suggests otherwise. The length of lunchtime may need to be extended to allow for greater social distancing in the school hall, but parents will be informed if this needs to happen at the start of the new term.

Attendance Children are expected to attend school as normal and the Government have said that "robust measures" will be taken if children do not attend, "education is not an option". Therefore I ask that you contact school via the school office email or telephone, if children are not able to attend. Our attendance clerk will telephone parents to ask why a child is absent, if no information is received.

Health and Safety Procedures will remain in place to manage effective daily cleaning and deep cleaning in classrooms and toilet areas in order to minimise risk. PPE will be available for all staff to use if required, especially if a child or member of staff is taken ill. The Governing Body and staff have the children at the heart of everything we do and the emphasis will be on minimising the risk to children and staff whilst maintaining the best possible education we can. The school Covid-19 risk assessment will be updated and shared with parents on the school website at the end of the summer break to ensure up to date guidance is incorporated into the actions.
