End of Year Statutory Assessments

As I am sure you are aware, the Government has cancelled the usual Year 2 end of Key Stage Statutory Assessment Tests (SATs). There will be no formal testing this summer for Year 2, however the staff will continue with their on-going regular assessments to inform their planning and to monitor pupil progress. We will work closely with Greasby Junior School staff to ensure that there is a smooth transition for our children. Further information about transition activities will be shared during the Summer Term, when we know more about how the Covid restrictions will impact on potential activities.

The Phonic Screening that usually takes place for Year 1 pupils has also been cancelled for this year. Staff will continue to monitor pupil progress in phonics during the daily phonic sessions.

End of year formal assessment for the Foundation 2 children have also been cancelled. Staff will continue with their on-going assessments throughout the term in order to inform planning and monitor pupil progress.

Covid-19 Update

Firstly I would like to thank everyone for their support and kindness throughout this term. It has been a difficult few months and all the staff have really appreciated your hard work with home learning and thoughtful gifts, which kept us going during lockdown.

It has been wonderful to have the children back and to see all their smiling faces and hear that buzz around school again.

Please can I remind parents and carers to stick to the allocated times for drop off and collection, as we are working hard to keep everyone as safe as possible. Please can you also remember to wear face coverings and maintain social distance when on the school site.

The DfE have requested that school continue to be involved in the contact tracing during the Easter Holidays. You can walk-in or book at www.wirral.gov.uk/test If you test positive at one of the testing centres you must self-isolate for 10 days. You will be contacted by NHS Test and Trace to identify any close contacts who also may need to self-isolate to prevent the spread of COVID-19.
