


## Congratulations to Daisy Aston who was the winner

#### Key Stage 1 Statutory Assessments

#### Year 2

As I am sure you are aware, the Year 2 children will soon be completing their end of Key Stage Statutory Assessment Tests (SATs). These will take place throughout the month of May and we aim to keep class routines as normal as possible. The children will continue to work as a whole class, in groups and as individuals to complete a range of assessments across Reading, Writing and Mathematics. The assessments do not have to be completed on set days and there will be days when the children do not complete any assessments and they may not even realise when they actually do!

The teachers aim to keep routines as normal as possible and we will not discuss the SATs with the children and we would appreciate it if parents did the same. We try to keep these assessments as low key as possible to prevent children from worrying about the tests especially as they only form a small part of a child's assessment profile.

At the end of the year, parents will be informed of their child's assessment results together with their end of year report. These results are a combination of the SATs and the regular ongoing assessments which take place throughout the year.

#### Year 1

All Year 1 children will take part in the phonic screening during the week beginning 11th June. These sessions will be completed on a one to one basis with the class teacher. Information regarding the outcome of the screening will be included in the end of year report. Year 2 pupils who did not achieve the expected standard last year will be rescreened.

#### Health Advice

**Tummy Bugs** It is very important that if your child is absent from school due to a tummy bug they should not return to school for 48 hours after their last bout of sickness or diarrhoea. This is the advice given by the Health Protection Agency to ensure that viruses are not passed from one child to another throughout the whole school community.

Please can you also encourage your child to adopt good hygiene practices, remembering to wash their hands after using the toilet.

#### Head Lice

Please can you check your child's hair for head lice on a regular basis. The recommendation from the school nurse is to check hair every 3-4 days. This is best done on wet hair using a fine tooth comb. If you have any concerns, you can discuss these with the school nurse by making an appointment via the school office.
